- 1. Annie Grady- SENDLO Officer, Wirral Council services offered include advice and support of care, early years, education, health and wellbeing, lifestyle, transport and preparation for adulthood. Annie also told us about the launch of the Wirral Neurodiversity Hub, which will offer early help and identification for support:
- There will be many resources to help everyone find the right support for Families seeking information to support a child's and their own needs at home, available for their wider family too, including topics like 'Preparing Your Child for Adulthood' and 'Parent Space'.
- Information for schools on reasonable adjustments.
- Teenagers will have their own 'Teenage Zone' in most sections, covering friendships, siblings, life as a young carer, and more.
- Young adults will have a section 'My Independent Life', with information on healthcare, money, and living at home.

- 4. Lynda Appleton- Senior Researcher, The Clatterbridge Cancer Centre NHS
 Foundation Trust- promoting their Carers study exploring views and experiences of
 unpaid Carers (often a family member or friend) who have long-term health conditions
 and who provide support to a person with cancer.
- The main aim of the <u>study</u> is to understand how family or friends manage their health and well-being when supporting a person with cancer; the coping strategies and support systems they use on a day-to-day basis and what can be done to better support Carers.
- The findings from the <u>study</u> will help to better support family or friends in their Caring role.

5. Debra Seery- Specialist Pelvic Health Assistant Practitioner, Wirral Community Health and Care NHS Foundation Trust's Perinatal Pelvic Health Service highlighting the Perinatal Pelvic Health Service programme.

The Perinatal Pelvic Health Service is part of the Cheshire and Merseyside programme aimed to improve access to perinatal pelvic health services and provide education around managing pelvic health, with a dedicated team delivering 1-1 clinics and classes at sites across the Wirral.

- From referral date, contact aim is within 6 weeks. They aim to see pregnant persons as soon as possible (typically 2-3 weeks).
- They offer advice and support on managing symptoms independently, with personalised exercises and treatments to help optimise symptoms.
- Treatment can include pelvic floor muscle exercises (Kegels), bladder training, tips to improve bowel function, relaxation and pain management, functional movement, and core strengthening.
- Classes for pregnant persons with pelvic girdle pain (SPD), including information on how to manage at home.
- Birth injuries such as 3rd and 4th degree tearing require specialist support early after delivery. Once referred into the service, contact will be via telephone asap to provide initial advice and support in managing symptoms, and face-to-face assessment from 6-weeks after delivery.

- 3. Healthwatch Wirral has joined colleagues across England to promote a <u>national petition</u> to protect the independence of local voices in Health and Care. We're encouraging as many people as possible to sign to show their support. The petition, 'Review decision to abolish independent local Healthwatch', asks the UK Government to:

- Consult with the public to co-design a service that meets their needs and supports NHS ambitions
- Invest in and strengthen independent services



Last month, the Dash Patient Safety Review was published. Its recommendations have been incorporated into the NHS 10-Year Health Plan, including proposals to transfer the functions of local Healthwatch into NHS Integrated Care Boards (ICBs) and local authorities. This is despite the review acknowledging: "Healthwatch, while not solely a patient safety organisation, plays a crucial role in promoting patient safety by amplifying patient voices. Since 2013, Healthwatch has made a significant impact, aiding over a million people annually to voice their concerns and access advice."

Very few local Healthwatch organisations were consulted, and it's deeply concerning that patients and the public, the people we serve, were not invited to share their views. This undermines the government's stated aim of placing "greater emphasis on the patient voice."

Karen Prior, CEO of Healthwatch Wirral, commented: "For over a decade, Healthwatch Wirral has been a trusted space where people can safely share their experiences. While the NHS 10-Year Plan outlines ambitions for gathering the voices of patients, it's deeply concerning that the public, the very people we serve, were not consulted. We urge decision-makers to listen, engage with the public, and co-design a future model that protects every person's voice."

Healthwatch Wirral provides independent information and advice, helping people find support, understand their rights, and navigate NHS and social care systems. This is especially vital for those who are vulnerable or unsure where to turn.

We are concerned that proposals to collect feedback solely through digital tools like the NHS App cannot replicate the depth of engagement that Healthwatch provides. This risks excluding digitally excluded groups and those facing health inequalities, people who may never be heard without proactive outreach.

Our independence allows people to speak freely and honestly. Without it, trust is lost, and feedback may go unheard.

We urge you to <u>sign the petition</u> and share it with colleagues, friends and your communities.
